

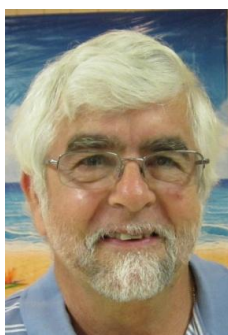

## From The President's Corner...

The Central Florida Metal Detecting Club finds table is one of the many reasons we continue to grow. It is very impressive to see the monthly finds stretch to cover over fifty feet of table space every month! The excitement generated at the finds

table is not something that just "happens." A lot of hard work goes into arranging items, taking pictures, voting, clean up, and the host of other activities necessary to display and track each member's finds. We know how important it is to address each find properly and are working to make things even better.

With growth comes change. Because the number of finds continues to increase every month, we want to try something new to make it easier to track entries so that every item is accounted for and each member gets proper credit as they deserve. This new method will eliminate the need for members to fill out the long monthly finds form.

This month we are going to ask each member who intends to place items on the finds tables to **first** "check-in" at a new table which will be set up near the finds table. At this table volunteers will quickly check off the number of categories you will be entering. A simple check mark near your name will indicate which categories you have entered. After completing this "check-in" process, move on and place your finds on the table, as always, along with the description of your item. As you check in, you will be given one ticket (one total) which will be used in a new drawing specifically for those that have placed entries on the table.

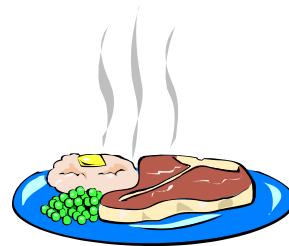
**We will meet the first Friday of April. Next month we meet again on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday.**

Happy Easter everyone!

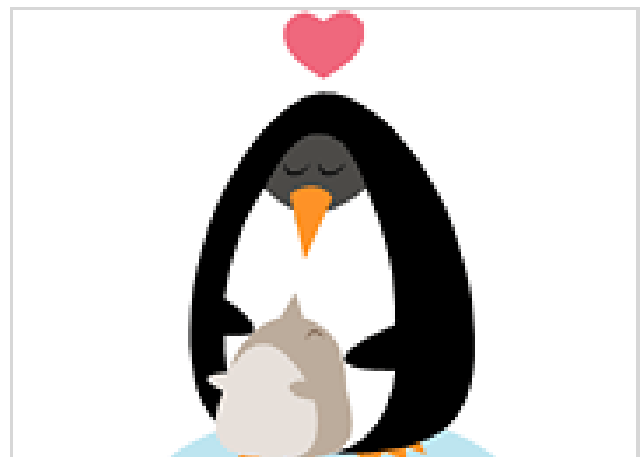
Soon I hope, very soon the weather will be getting warmer (I hope). Then we will probably be complaining about the heat.
