George Case gave both Ray and Lonna a certificate as well.

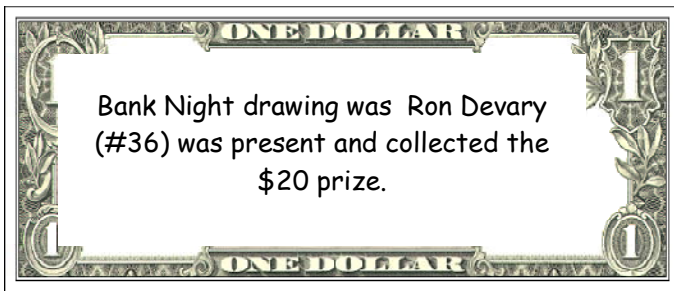

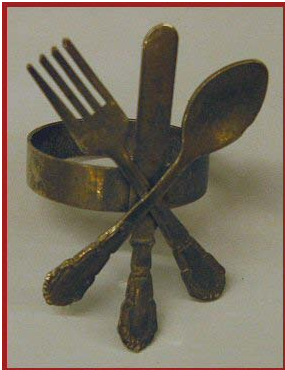
